

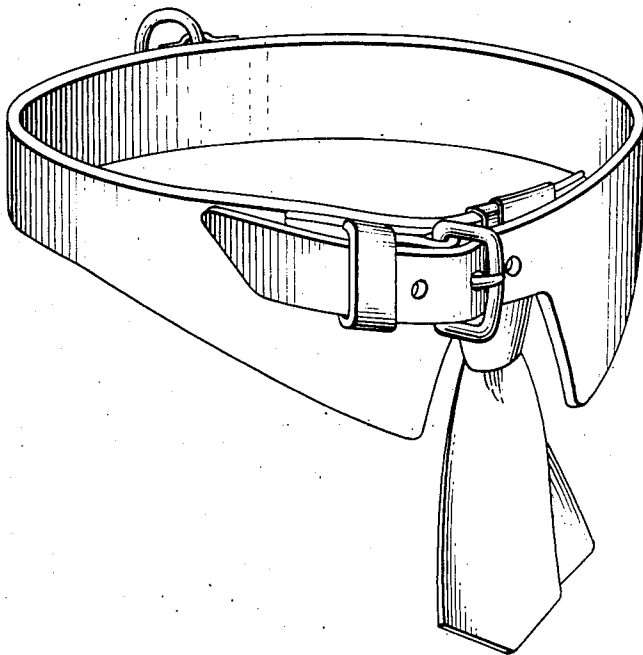

DESIGN FOR A COMBINED DOG COLLAR AND TIE

Morris Oppenheim, New York, N. Y.

To all whom it concern:

Be it known that I, Morris Oppenheim, a citizen of the United States, residing at 2830 Olinville Avenue, county of the Bronx, city and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Combined Dog Collar and Tie, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The figure is a perspective view of the combined dog collar and tie, showing my new design.

The characteristic feature of my design re-

sides in the combination on a dog collar of the specific design disclosed including a relatively small four-in-hand tie, the upper portion of the knot of which is concealed by an overlapping buckle strap, and the lower portion thereof being exposed between V-shaped tabs, all as shown.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a combined dog collar and tie, as shown and described.
