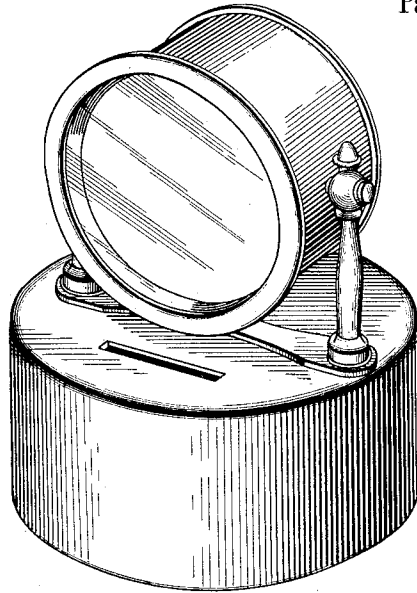

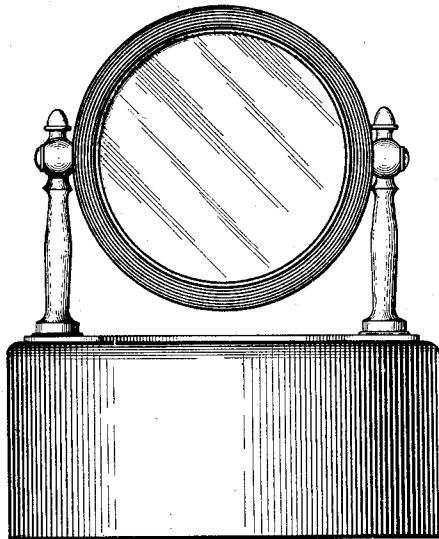

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDMUND S. HOCHÉ, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Clock-Bank Case, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part hereof.

Figure 1 is a perspective view, and Fig. 2 is a front elevational view of a clock-bank case in accordance with my new design.

The design is intended for use in a combi-

nation savings-bank and clock; and while the design preferably is of the form shown, such variations as may be made without materially modifying the design are contemplated.
