

(57) Abstract: Devices, systems, and methods for depleting fluids of immunoglobulins and leukocytes are disclosed. A method for removing immunoglobulins and leukocytes from a biological fluid comprises: (a) placing the biological fluid in contact with immunoglobulin-specific binding media; and, (b) passing the biological fluid through a porous fibrous leukocyte depletion filter to obtain immunoglobulin- and leukocyte-depleted biological fluid
