DESIGN FOR CARPET.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 37,107, dated August 30, 1904.

Application filed May 14, 1904. Serial No. 208,047. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES F. ROMIEU, a citizen of the United States, and a resident of Arlington, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Carpet, of which the following is a specification.

The figure of my new and original design, as shown in the accompanying drawing, illustrates a section of a carpet having said design thereon.

The drawing shows one complete portion of the design and the right and left sides of two other portions of the design, said portions

making a complete pattern if the right and left hand edges of the drawing be placed contiguous to each other. Said figure is what is called in the art a "design" which is reversed on its center cord.

What I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The ornamental design for a carpet substantially as shown.
