

DESIGN FOR A TRAY.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,612, dated April 13, 1886.

Application filed February 13, 1886. Serial No. 191,901. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AUGUST LEDIG, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Trays, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, forming part thereof.

10 The leading features of my design are, first, the body with a checkered face, a plain field at the center, and a plain field between said face and the rim of the tray, and, next, a rim with a beaded edge, a scalloped face, and
15 rounded corners.

A represents a tray, the face B of the body of which is checkered, excepting at the center, where there is a plain field, C. The rim D is scalloped, and the corners E are curved
20 inwardly. The portion of the face where it joins the rim D is a plain field, and the outer edge of said rim is beaded, the scallops or corrugations of the rim being on the face there-

of. The rounded corners E are within the rounded corners of the beaded edge of the rim, said corners E joining the scalloped faces
25 of the rim.

I claim—

1. A design for a tray having a body with a checkered surface, B, a plain center field, C, and a rim, D, having inwardly-rounded corners E, substantially as shown.

2. A design for a tray having a body with a checkered surface and a rim with a beaded edge and scalloped face, as shown and described.

3. A design for a tray having a body with a checkered surface, and a rim with a beaded edge and beaded corners, a scalloped face, and rounded corners joining the scalloped faces,
40 as shown and described.
