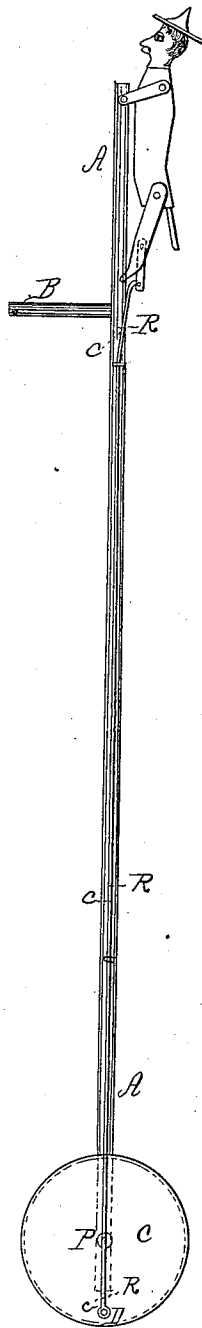

TOY.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, JOSHUA PUSEY, of the city of Philadelphia, county of Philadelphia, and State of Pennsylvania, have invented a new and improved "Toy;" and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings making a part of this specification, and showing a perspective view of my toy.

The object of my invention is to provide an amusing toy to be used as a cane.

To enable those skilled in the art to make and use my invention, I will now proceed to describe its construction and operation.

A is simply a round stick, and made of any kind of wood, and of any desired length. B is a piece of wood, inserted in A, and made straight, as shown in the drawings, or curved, and is intended to serve as a handle on the lower end of A; and secured by means of a pin, P, on which it revolves, is a wooden wheel, C, the said wheel extending down a short distance below the end of A. On the face of C is fastened a pin, D, to which is attached a connecting-rod, C R, the said rod extending the length of A, and held in proper place by means of staples.

On the upper end of C R is secured a small wooden block, to which is attached a loose-jointed figure.

The operation is as follows: B is taken in the hand, with wheel C resting on the ground. C is now propelled along, and sets in motion connecting-rod C R, which gives movement to the jointed figure on the head of A.

Having thus described my invention, its construction and operation, what I claim, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

A toy, arranged, constructed, and operating in the manner as above set forth and described.
