







To all whom it may concern:

Be it known, that I, Nina Baroumes, a citizen of the United States, residing at Juneau, in the Territory of Alaska, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Shoe, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part hereof.
