

DESIGN FOR A COMB.

Specification forming part of Design No. **7,152**, dated February 3, 1874; application filed October 1, 1873.
 [Term of Patent 14 years.]

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WILLIAM PAULY, of College Point, Long Island, in the State of New York, have invented and produced a new Design in that class of combs known as combination side combs, in which two side combs are connected by an elastic band extending over the head, reference being had to the accompanying drawings making part of this specification, in which my design is fully illustrated.

Figure 1 is a perspective view, and Fig. 2 a side elevation, of my new design.

The same letters indicate like parts in both figures.

a represent the two ranges of teeth, which are like side combs; and *b*, the elastic band

connecting them, and which, in use, extends over the upper part of the head. This constitutes what is well known as a combination comb, the side combs and elastic band being usually made of one piece. From the rear edge of the band, and in the middle between the two ranges of teeth, projects the ornament *c*, in the form of a coronet or segment of a crown, ornamented by cutting such figures as are represented.

I claim—

The design for a band-comb, substantially as hereinbefore described and shown.
