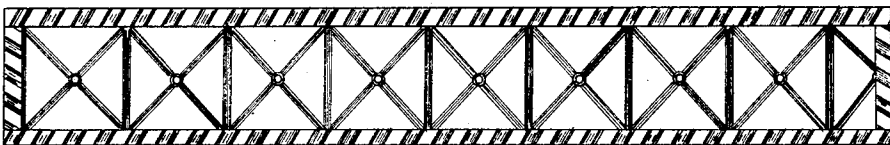
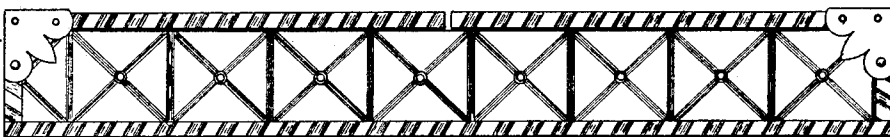

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, DAVID J. O'BRIEN, a citizen of the United States, residing at Omaha, in the county of Douglas and State of Nebraska, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Confectionery-Box, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

Figure 1 is a plan view of the confectionery box. Fig. 2 is an end view of the same. Fig. 3 is a side view of the box.
