DESIGN FOR WALL-PAPER.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 20,225, dated October 21, 1890.

Application filed September 27, 1890. Serial No. 366,378. Term of patent $3\frac{1}{4}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES BOOZE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Buffalo, in the county of Erie and State of New York, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Wall-Paper, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying photograph, forming part thereof.

The leading feature of my design consists of a series of arabesque scrolls, with flowers arranged at uniform distances apart within the scrolls and dotted curves arranged in various forms between the scrolls, as represented

in the accompanying photograph. The scrolls 15
are arranged in various forms to cover the
surface of the paper, and are printed in any
desired color upon tinted paper of any desired
color.

What I claim is—

described.
