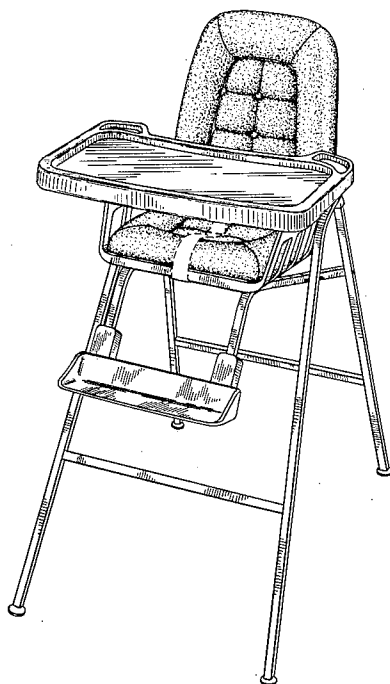

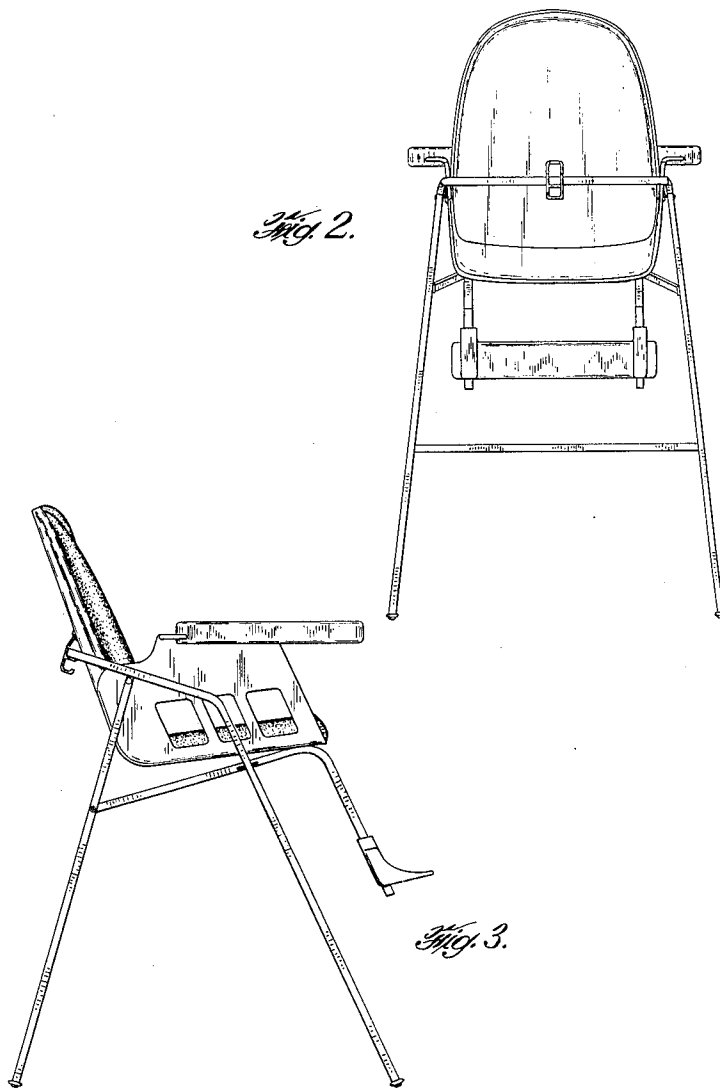


FIG. 1 is a front perspective view of a high chair embodying our design with strap means being shown in broken lines for the purpose of illustration;
