IMPROVEMENT IN COMPOUNDS FOR STOVE-POLISH.

The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ROBERT E. CHERRINGTON, of South Boston, in the county of Suffolk and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new and Improved Compound for Stove-Polish; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, which will enable others skilled in the art to make and use the same.

This invention relates to a new compound for a stove-polish; and

It consists in a combination of glycerine and plumbago, in any proportion that will hold the plumbago in a suitable pasty condition for packing for storage and transportation, and will prevent the plumbago from escaping or being thrown off when being rubbed on the stove or other article with a brush.

The glycerine is particularly favorable for this preparation, as it does not evaporate or freeze in the temperature to which it is likely to be exposed.

Having thus described my invention,

I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent,—

The improved compound for stove-blackening, consisting of glycerine and plumbago, mixed to form a suitable paste, for the purpose specified.
