IMPROVED RHEUMATIC LINIMENT.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 40,668, dated November 17, 1863.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LOUISA E. ANDERSON, of St. Louis, in the county of St. Louis and State of Missouri, have invented a new and Improved Medicine or Liniment for the Cure of Rheumatism; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and accurate description of the ingredients composing the same, viz: one dozen eggs, one dozen garden-pepper, one pint mustard, one roll brimstone, and one-fourth ounce gum-camphor, inclosed in a vessel and roasted before a slow fire until dissolved into liniment. During the process of cooling

stir in one-half pint turpentine, one-fourth ounce laudanum.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United States, is—

The medicine or liniment compounded of the materials and in the manner substantially as set forth above.
