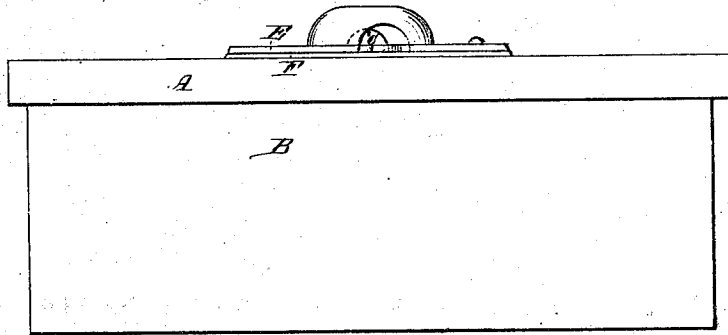

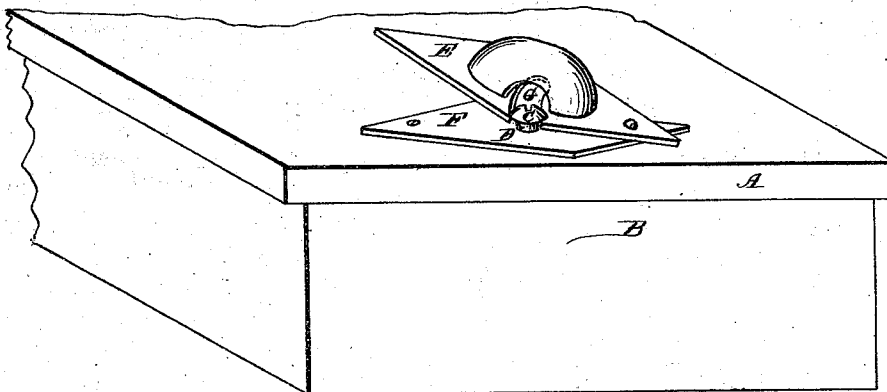

IMPROVEMENT IN FASTENINGS FOR COFFINS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **143,748**, dated October 21, 1873; application filed September 10, 1873.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WARREN S. CRANE, of Rome, county of Floyd, State of Georgia, have invented an Improvement in Fastenings for Coffins, &c., of which the following is a specification:

The object of my invention is to fasten the lid of a coffin quickly and easily.

The lid A A is placed on the box B B, letting the screw C (which is inserted in box B B) come through the hole D. The cap E is turned, covering the plate F and allowing the

slot G to slide under the head of the screw C, as shown in Figure 2.

The fastening is shown closed in the side view, Fig. 1.

I claim as my invention—

The combination of the cap E and slot G, perforated plate F, and screw C as a coffin-fastening, substantially as described.
