





To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Karl P. Janoff, a citizen of the United States, residing at Belleville, State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Combined Shoehorn and Comb, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part hereof.

In the accompanying drawing:

Figure 1 is a front view of a combined shoehorn and comb, showing my new design.

Figure 2 is a top plan view thereof showing the shoehorn partly in section on line 2—2 of Figure 1.

Figure 3 is a cross-sectional view on the line 3—3 of Figure 1.

Figure 4 is a view of the opposite side from that shown in Figure 1.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a combined shoehorn and comb, substantially as shown.
