


## MUCILAGE-BOTTLE.

*The Schedule referred to in these Letters Patent and making part of the same.*

### TO ALL WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

Be it known that I, A. M. OLDS, of New York, of the county and State of the same name, have invented a new and improved Mucilage-Bottle; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters of reference marked thereon. In said drawings—

Figure 1 represents a bottle with this invention attached.

Figure 2 is a view of the same, a part being broken away, showing it as adjusted.

Similar letters of reference indicate like parts.

This invention consists in constructing and arranging a brush in connection with a capped mucilage-bottle, so that it may be adjusted for use without detaching it therefrom.

A represents a bottle; B, a cap, which is attached to same; C, a tube-connection for the brush D to slide in, the bottom being the smallest so as to prevent too rapid a flow of mucilage when in use; E, a spring, one end being attached to the brush, the other to a wire, F, which is secured to the cap B. H is a small wire (or cord) passing through said tube and connecting the brush with the hinged cap I, said cap having a projection, J, for operating. The caps and tube may be constructed of spelter or other metal, and attached to the mouth of a common bottle; the spring composed of rubber or wire coil.

In operating, the bottle is used as a handle for the brush. Place the fore-finger upon the projection J and draw it over to the collar of the cap, thereby adjusting the brush for use. Remove the finger and it assumes an inside position, closing the orifice—a desideratum when not in use.

I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

Constructing and arranging, in connection with a bottle, an upright adjustable brush, operating through its cap, substantially as and for the purposes herein set forth.
