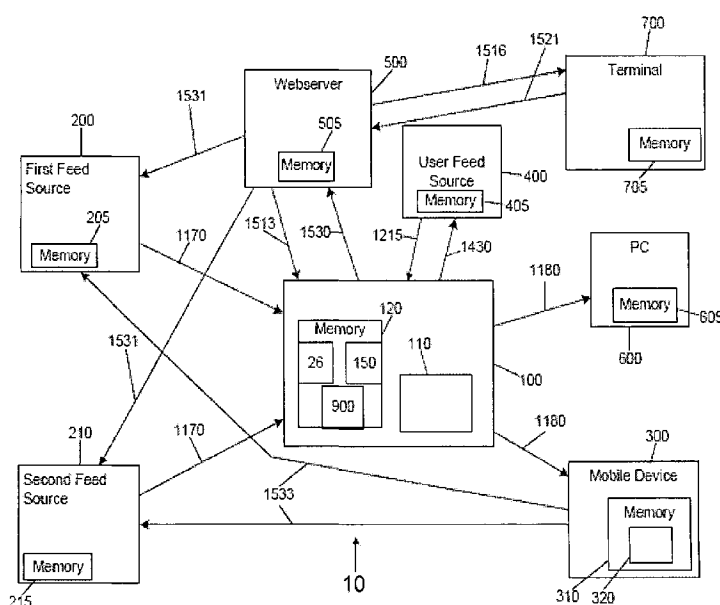

(57) Abstract: A user is provided with access
to his or her account information using a client.
The account information is stored on a server
which receives the information from a feed
source and transmits the information to the
client. A method for downloading and in-
stalling specialized software for viewing the ac-
count information on the client is also provid-
ed. The information can be received from dif-
ferent feed sources in different formats and
converted to a format that is compatible with
the intended receiving client. Encryption can
be used to protect the privacy of the users of
the system and the account information therein.
Additionally, a special access password and a
privileged access routine can be used to pro-
vide access to an authorized third party user on
a temporary basis.

The inventions listed as Groups I-II do not relate to a single general inventive concept under PCT Rule 13.1 because, under PCT Rule 13.2, they lack the same or corresponding special technical features for the following reasons: the special technical feature of the Group I invention: storing the feed source information in a database and selecting a subset of the account information to send to the client as claimed therein is not present in the invention of Group II. The special technical feature of the Group II invention: the use of an encryption key and password/user identification to download software onto a client device as claimed therein is not present in the invention of Groups I.

Groups I and II lack unity of invention because even though the inventions of these groups require the technical feature of receiving and converting medical information at a server, this technical feature is not a special technical feature as it does not make a contribution over the prior art in view of US 6,192,112 B1 (RAPAPORT et al) 20 February 2001, column 2, lines 41-57.

Since none of the special technical features of the Group I or II inventions are found in more than one of the inventions, unity of invention is lacking.
