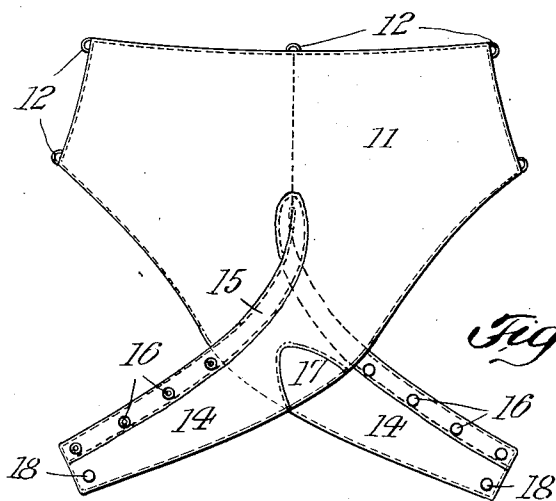
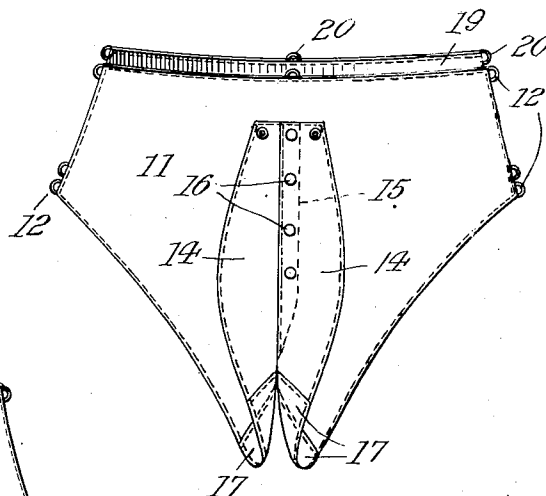
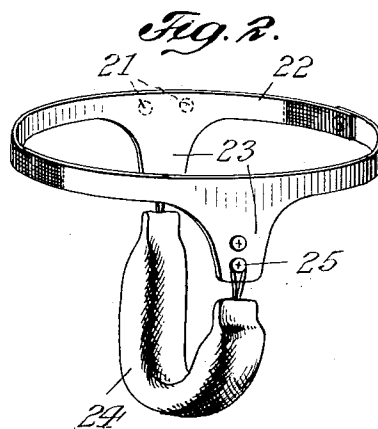
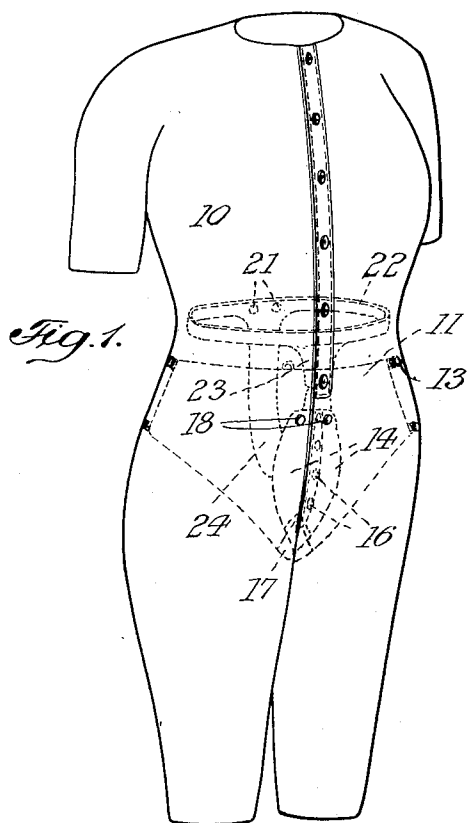

LADY'S UNDERGARMENT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HERMAN ESHBORN, a citizen of the United States, residing at New York city, county and State of New York, have invented a new and Improved Lady's Undergarment, of which the following is a specification.

This invention relates to an undergarment of novel construction and more particularly to novel and efficient means for keeping such garment in a neat and cleanly condition during menstruation.

In the accompanying drawing: Figure 1 is a perspective view of an undergarment embodying my invention; Fig. 2 a perspective view of the belt and pad detached; Fig. 3 a perspective view of the lining detached, showing it buttoned, and Fig. 4 a similar view of the lining showing it unbuttoned.

The invention comprises essentially a combination garment 10, in which the waist and drawers are made integral with each other as usual. Within the seat of this garment there is fitted a removable lining or insert 11 having loops 12, so that it may be secured in position by buttons 13 attached to the inner side of the back of the garment. Lining 11 comprises an upper continuous seat portion which is provided with a pair of depending flaps 14 separated by a central slit and reinforced along each inner edge by a binding tape 15 provided with coacting fasteners 16. At their outer edges gores 17 are inserted into the flaps, which permit them to be

folded around the limbs of the wearer, and to be thence buttoned together by the fasteners 16. Additional fasteners 18 at the end of the flaps permit them to be then secured to the inner side of the front of garment 10. Between the garment and the lining, there is interposed a water proof sheet 19 made of rubber or similar material and secured in position by fastening means 20. This sheet is indicated in Fig. 3 and may be made of the same general shape as the lining. To the back of garment 10, there is buttoned at 21, at a slight distance above the upper edge of lining 11, a belt 22 provided with front and rear flaps 23. To these flaps there is removably secured a pad 24 by means of fasteners 25.

It will be seen that the parts of the garment constructed as described, may be readily assembled, that the garment is comfortable in use, and that it effectively prevents soiling of the clothes.

I claim:

An undergarment provided with a removable insert that comprises an upper seat portion and a pair of depending flaps that are separated by a central slit, means for securing the flaps to each other along the slit, means for securing the seat portion to the back of garment, and means for securing the flaps to the front of the garment.
