

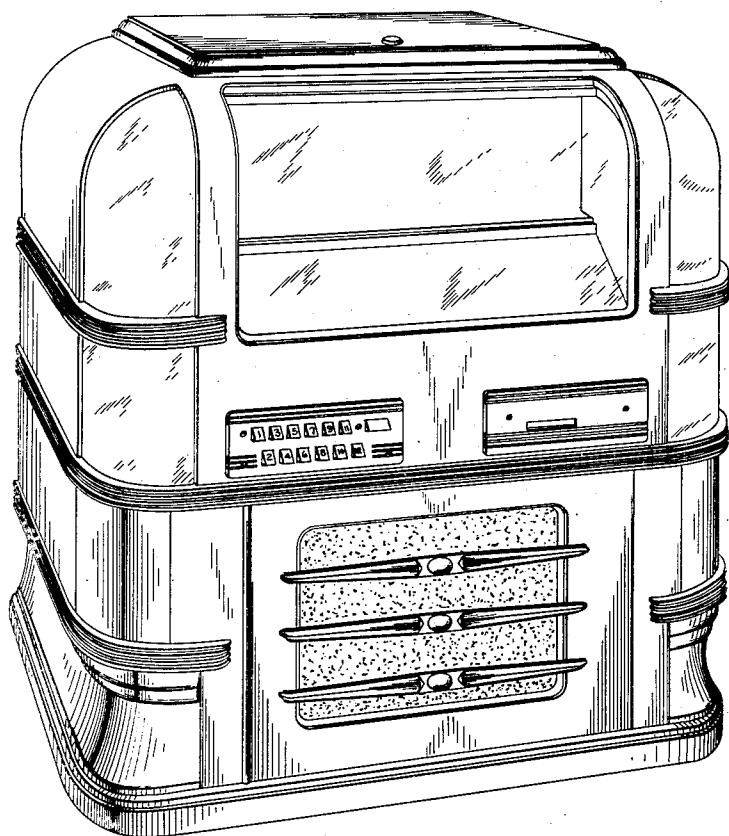

DESIGN FOR A PHONOGRAPH CABINET

Paul M. Fuller, Chicago, Ill., assignor to The Rudolph Wurlitzer Company, North Tonawanda, N. Y., a corporation of Ohio

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Paul M. Fuller, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Phonograph Cabinet, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

The figure shown on the drawing is a perspective view of the phonograph cabinet embodying my design. That side of the cabinet not shown on the drawing is the same as the side shown.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a phonograph cabinet, substantially as shown and described.
