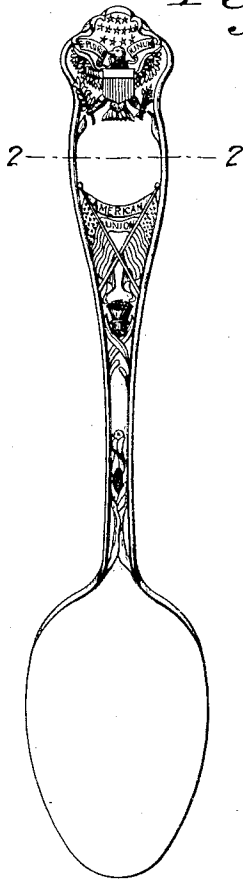

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, GEORGE H. PINNEY, a citizen of the United States, residing at South Manchester, in the county of Hartford and State of Connecticut, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Spoons, Forks, and Similar Articles, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof, in which—

Figure 1 is a face view of a spoon or fork

embodying my invention. Fig. 2 is a view in cross section through the same on plane denoted by dotted line 2—2 of Fig. 1.
