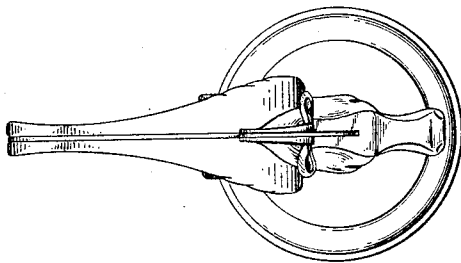

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOSEPH KLEIDMAN, a citizen of Poland, residing at New York, in the county of Kings and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Temperature Indicator for Radiators of Automobiles, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a side elevation of an indicator for radiators of automobiles, showing my new design; and Fig. 2 is a plan view thereof.
