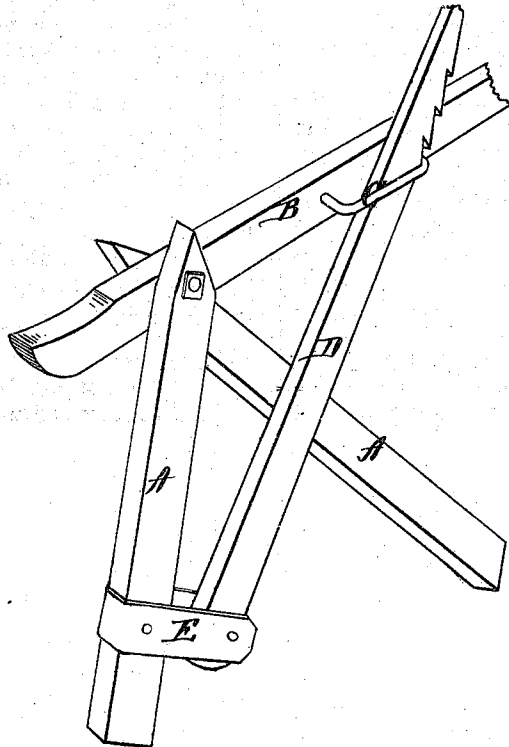

IMPROVEMENT IN LIFTING-JACKS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 126,800, dated May 14, 1872.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, AMOS M. GILMORE, of Greensburg, in the county of Decatur and in the State of Indiana, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Wagon-Jacks; and do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof, reference being had to the accompanying drawing and to the letters of reference marked thereon making a part of this specification.

The nature of my invention consists in the construction and arrangement of a "lifting-jack," as will be hereinafter more fully set forth.

In order to enable others skilled in the art to which my invention appertains to make and use the same, I will now proceed to describe its construction and operation, referring to the annexed drawing which represents a perspective view of my invention.

A A represent the two legs of my lifting-jack, between the upper ends of which is pivoted the lever B, said lever being provided

with a staple, C, as shown. On one of the legs A is a clevis, E, to which is pivoted a handle, D, which is notched on its under side, and passes through the staple C, the notches catching on the same.

This lifting-jack can be easily adjusted to any height desired by the use of the lever B and ratchet-bar or notched handle D.

Having thus fully described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The combination of the legs A A, lever B with staple C, clevis E, and ratchet-bar or notched handle D, all constructed and arranged substantially as and for the purposes herein set forth.
