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

(54) Title: DEVICES AND METHODS FOR DELIVERY OF ATTACHMENT DEVICES



(57) Abstract: In a generic aspect, an apparatus for delivering attachment devices includes a needle defining a lumen and a distal opening, and a plurality of attachment devices disposed within the lumen of the needle. Each attachment device includes a first attachment part, a second attachment part, and a connecting member coupled to the first attachment part and the second attachment part. The apparatus further includes an actuator configured to drive each attachment device out of the distal opening of the needle during a surgical procedure.

The characterizing features relate to the technical problem of making the use of the apparatus for complicated placement paths of the anchor-suture-(anchor) combinations easer;

an apparatus according to claim 7 or 22, characterized by the features introduced by claim 7 or 22, which stricto sensu (when considering that the attaching member defines a lumen and connecting member extends through that lumen and is connected therein by some means) relate to the technical problem of increasing the attachment safety of the attaching member to tissue by allowing the connecting member to slide toward the centre of the attaching member after its application.
