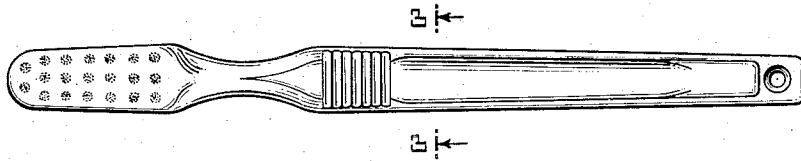

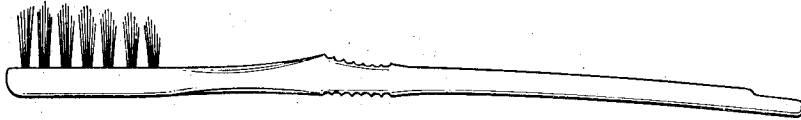

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, Clemence J. Wibbelsman and Richard E. Hitchcock, citizens of the United States, residing, respectively, at Loudonville, Albany County, State of New York, and at Birmingham, Oakland County, State of Michigan, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Toothbrush, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part hereof.

Fig. 1 is a top view of a toothbrush embodying our new design;

Fig. 2 is a side elevational view; and

Fig. 3 is a cross sectional view through the handle of the brush, along the lines 3—3 of Fig. 1.
