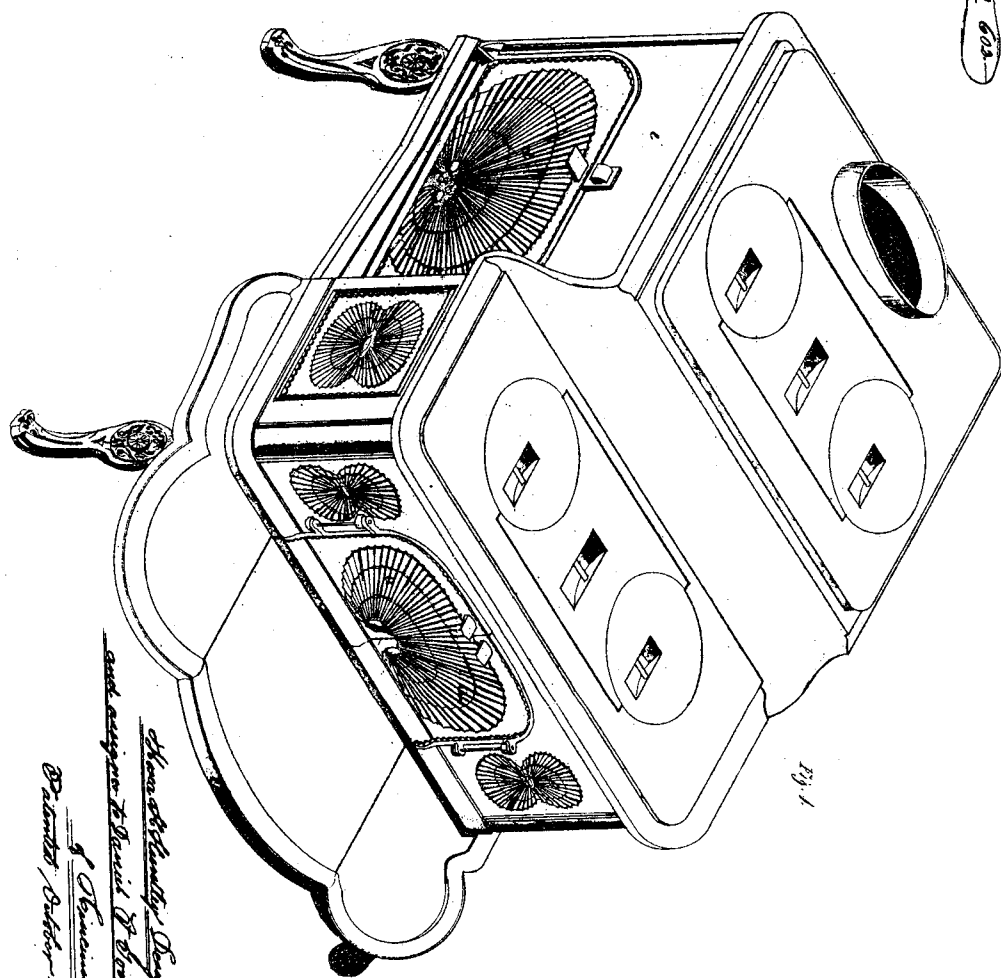

The schedule referred to in these Letters Patent, and making part of the same. &c.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known, that I, Hosea H. Huntley, of the City of Cincinnati, in the County of Hamilton, and State of Ohio, have produced or invented a new and original design for a Cooking Stove designated by the name of Challenge Preference, and I do hereby declare that the following is a full and exact description of the same, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, and to the letters and figures of reference marked thereon, making part of this specifications.

The accompanying drawing, fig. 1, represents a perspective view of the stove mounted on its feet, showing its front, side, and top.

a, a, represents the doors of the front of the stove, leading to the furnace, and furnished with an ornament representing a series of shells in relief, one half of each shell being carved on each door. The doors around their edges are furnished with a small moulding, and on the inside of the moulding, it is ornamented with circular notching, as represented in the drawing. The front plates on each side of the doors are ornamented with shells B, B, carved on in relief.

The side plate e, is furnished with mouldings around its edges, and the portion of it opposite the furnace is formed into a panel, and ornamented with shell work c, similar to the doors. The oven door d, is ornamented with a series of shells, carved on it in relief, and finished around its edges with a head moulding similar to the front doors leading to the furnace. Other ornamental parts and configurations not here specified are fully represented in the accompanying drawing.

What I claim as my invention or production, and desire to have secured by Letters Patent, is the combination and arrangement of the ornamental forms and configurations of a cooking stove, as represented in the accompanying drawings, forming an ornamental design, as before described.
