


DESIGN FOR A BOW FOR EAR-RINGS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,611, dated April 13, 1886.

Application filed February 17, 1886. Serial No. 192,309. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ANTHONY HESSELS, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented a new and original Design for Bows for Ear-Rings, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, making part of this specification.

In the drawings, Figure 1 is a front view of an ear-ring constructed with my newly-designed ear-ring bow, and Fig. 2 is a side view of the same.

Similar letters of reference indicate corresponding parts.

Heretofore the bows or hooks for ear-rings, from which a gem-holder is suspended, were made of uniform thickness throughout, and had a rather meager and thin appearance.

The leading feature of my design consists in a widened and thickened part of the front of the bow, extending from the top to the eye at which the gem-holder is suspended, said part gradually increasing in width from the top downward.

A is the gem-holder; B, the gem in the same; C, the eye of the gem-holder; D, the ring passed through said eye; E, the bow or hook; F, the catch on the lower end of the bow; and G is the front part of the bow, which gradually increases in width and thickness from the top of the bow down to the eye or ring D.

Having thus described my design, I claim as new and desire to secure by Letters Patent—

The design for an ear-ring neck or bow, consisting of the part G on the front of the bow, which part G gradually increases in width from its upper to its lower end, which lower end is located at the eye from which the gem-setting is suspended, substantially as set forth.
