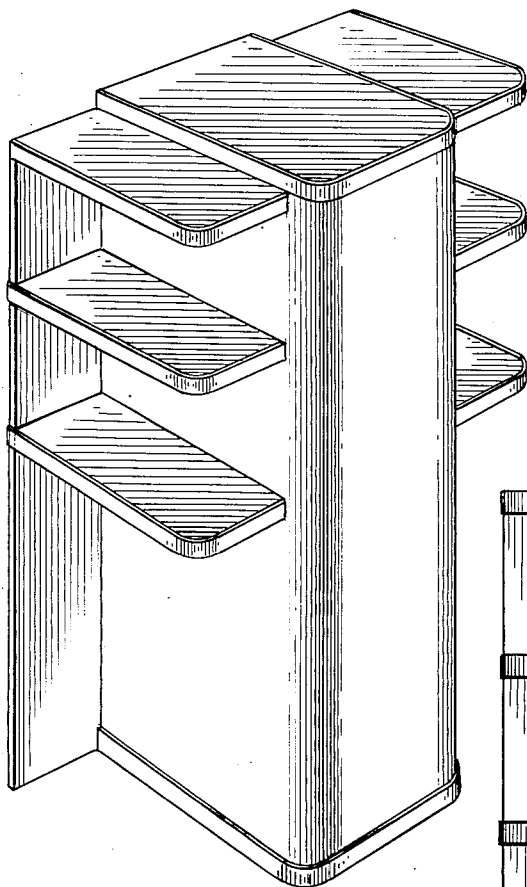

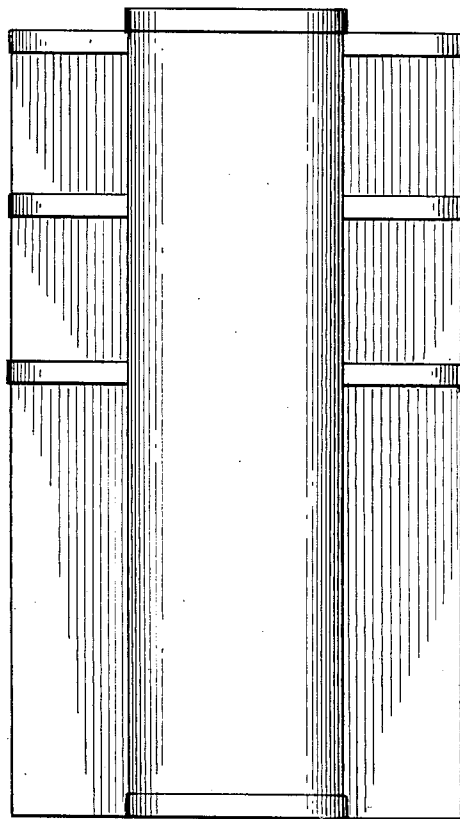
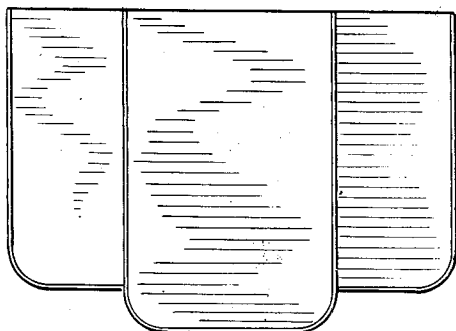

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Francis C. Ellis, a citizen of the United States, residing in Chicago, Cook County, State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Pedestal for a Scientific Instrument, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

Fig. 1 is a perspective view of a pedestal for a scientific instrument showing my new design;

Fig. 2 is a front elevational view of the pedestal; and

Fig. 3 is a top plan view of same.
