

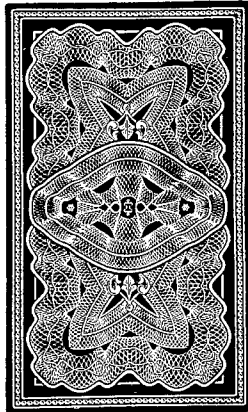

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, WALTER C. MAJOR, a citizen of the United States of America and of the State of New York, and residing at No. 515 West One Hundred and Eighty-seventh street, New York city, county and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Playing-Cards, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.
