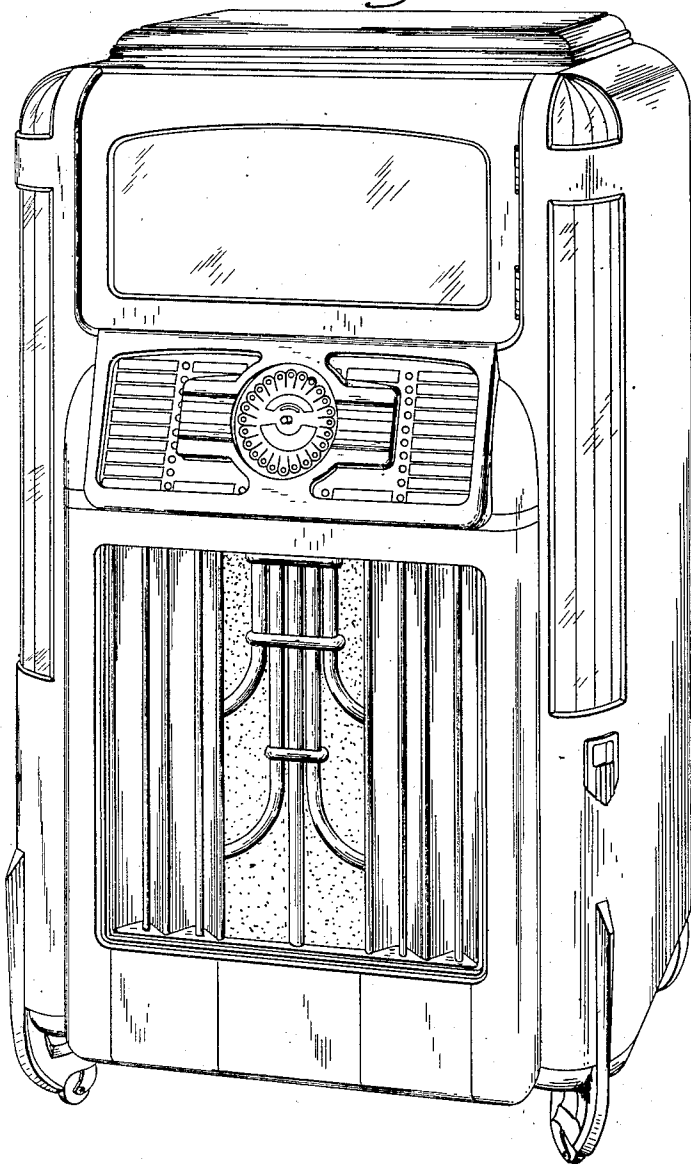
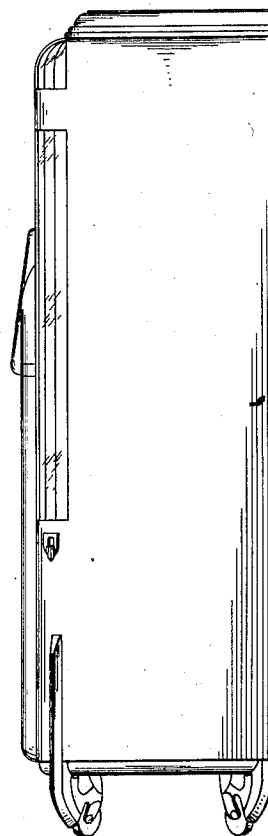

DESIGN FOR A PHONOGRAPH CABINET

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Paul M. Fuller, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Phonograph Cabinet, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

This application is a continuation in part of my design application, Serial No. D. 73,773, filed December 20, 1937.

Figure 1 is a perspective view of the phonograph cabinet embodying my design. Figure 2 is a right

hand end view of the same on a somewhat reduced scale.

That side of the cabinet not shown in the drawing is the same as the side shown.

The tube elements disposed centrally of the grill below the selector panel and the corner panels shown at the opposite sides of the cabinet are of a translucent material and illuminable.

I claim:

The ornamental design for a phonograph cabinet, substantially as shown and described.
