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
PAIR OF SPECTACLES

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




FIG. 1 is a front view of a pair of spectacles showing my new design;

FIG. 2 is a side view of said pair of spectacles taken from the left side thereof as viewed in FIG. 1;

FIG. 3 is a top plan view thereof;

FIG. 4 is a front view of another embodiment of the design shown in FIGS. 1 to 3;

FIG. 5 is a side view taken from the left side thereof as viewed in FIG. 4; and

FIG. 6 is a top plan view thereof.

The sides not shown have substantially the same appearance as the sides respectively shown.

The dominant features of my design reside in those portions shown in full lines. The temples are shown broken away in FIGS. 3 and 6 for convenience of illustration.

I claim:
