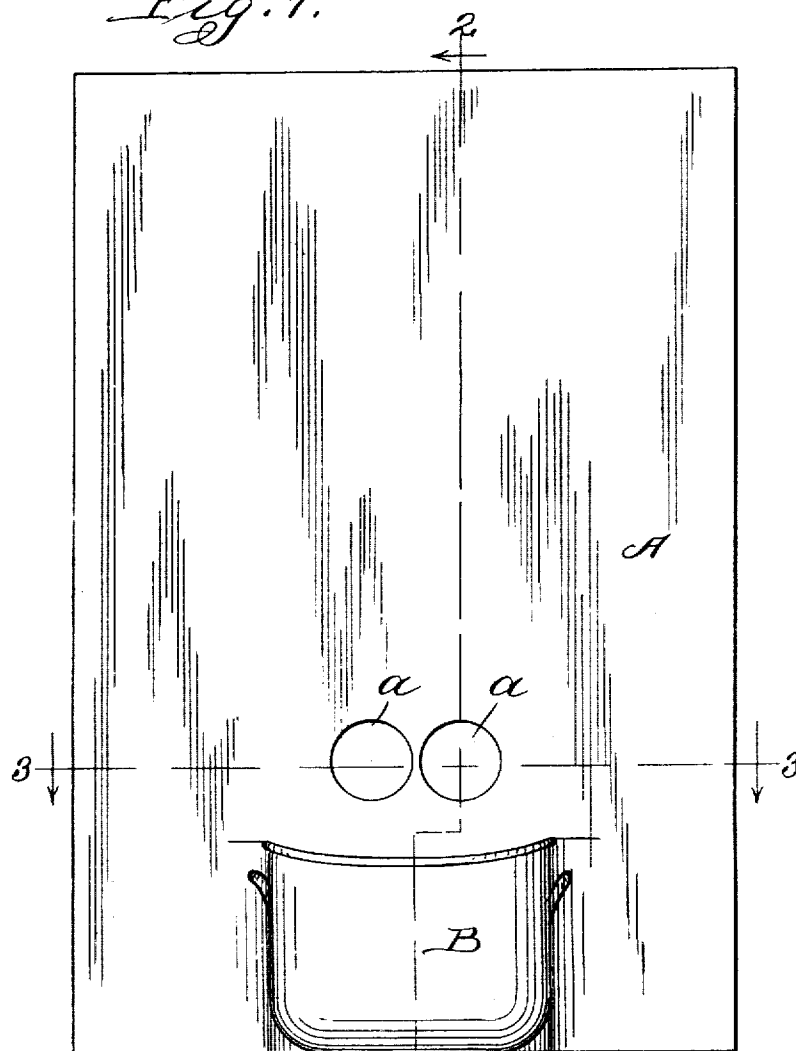

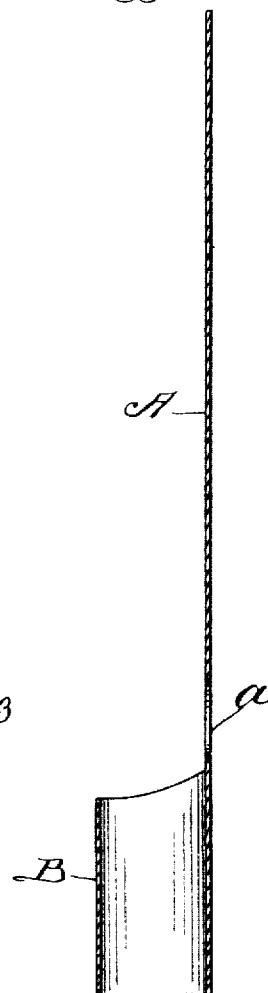
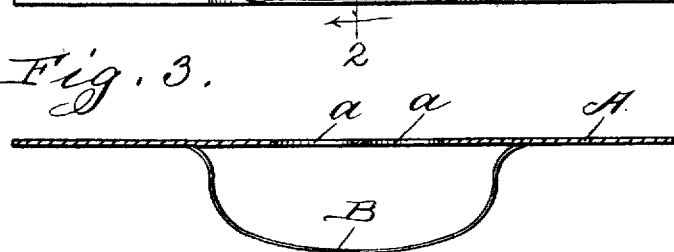

DESIGN FOR A GAME-BOARD.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 33,353, dated October 9, 1900.

Application filed August 27, 1900. Serial No. 28,263. Term of patent 3½ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, MAURICE LAZARE, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented and produced a new and original Design for Game-Boards, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a face view of a game-board, showing my new design. Fig. 2 is a sectional view taken on line 2 2 of Fig. 1 looking in the direction indicated by the arrows; and Fig. 3 is a cross-sectional view taken on line 3 3 of Fig. 1, also looking in the direction indicated by the arrows.

As shown in the drawings, the leading or material feature of my design consists of a piece A, rectangular in shape and having in

its lower central portion two circular openings *a*, located side by side. Below said openings the piece A is formed or provided with an outwardly-curved piece B, which extends to the bottom of the piece A and is joined to said piece at its sides, as is clearly shown in the drawings.

Having described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a game-board, substantially as herein shown and described.
