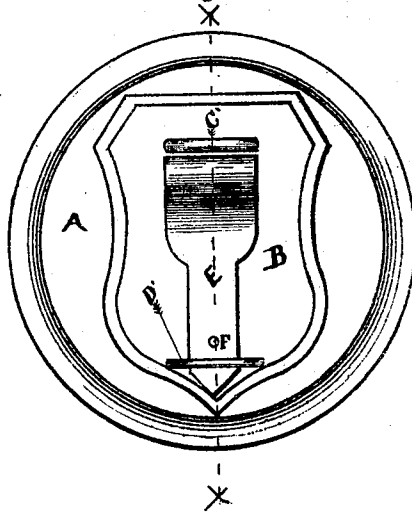
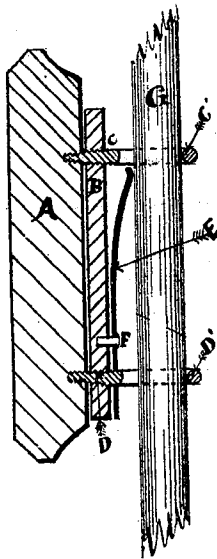

IMPROVEMENT IN BROOM-HOLDERS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. 124,445, dated March 12, 1872.

Specification describing certain Improvements in Broom-Holders, invented by HORACE B. McCOOL, of Pottsville, Pennsylvania.

The object of my invention is to construct and manufacture a convenient, cheap, and efficient Broom-Holder, and I have made the following improvements:

Figure 1 is a view of my improved broom-holder. Fig. 2 is a vertical sectional view of the same on the line *x x*, Fig. 1, also showing a portion of a broom-handle.

A represents a round block fastened by aid of a wood-screw to a door, door-frame, or a wall. The plate B, made of wood or metal or any other suitable material, of any desirable pattern or shape, is fastened to the block A by aid of the two screws C and D, the screw-eye D' confining the spring E, which is held in position by the small pin F.

When the block A is fastened to a door or wall the end of the broom-handle G is pushed up through the screw-eyes C' and D', and is held there by aid of the spring E, the broom-head hanging downward. Thus a broom is handy and easily put away when not used, and held in its place in a neat, convenient, and lasting manner.

Having thus described my invention, I desire to claim—

The block A, the plate B, screws C and D, with the screw-eyes C' and D', spring E and pin F, all combined substantially as and for the purpose hereinbefore set forth.
