



DESIGN FOR A BASE FOR LAMPS.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 25,141, dated February 11, 1896.

Application filed December 21, 1895. Serial No. 572,954. Term of patent 31 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, LOUIS HORNBERGER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Bridgeport, Fairfield county, Connecticut, bave invented a new Design for Bases for Lamps and the Like, of which the following is a specification.

The accompanying drawings represent my base, Figure 1 in perspective, and on a smaller

to scale, Fig. 2, in top plan view.

The invention relates to a design for a base adapted to lamps and other articles; and the design consists in the configuration and ornamentation thereof, as shown in the illustrations. The base is in shape of low irregular conical form with four projecting feet ornamented with medallions and scrolls, the border of the base proper being ornamented with alternate medallions and scallop-shells

together with flowers and scrolls raised above 20 the surface of the base. Above the border is a concave plain member surrounding a central horizontal ornamented circular top.

The leading feature of the design is the medallions and scallop-shells with flowers and 25 scrolls bordering the body of the base with the feet ornamented with medallions and scrolls.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent of the United 30 States, is as follows:

The design for a base for lamps herein shown and described.
