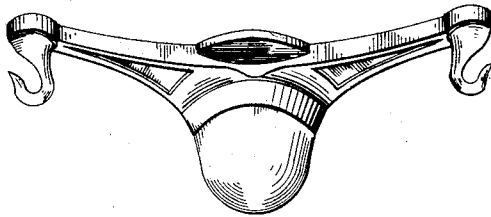
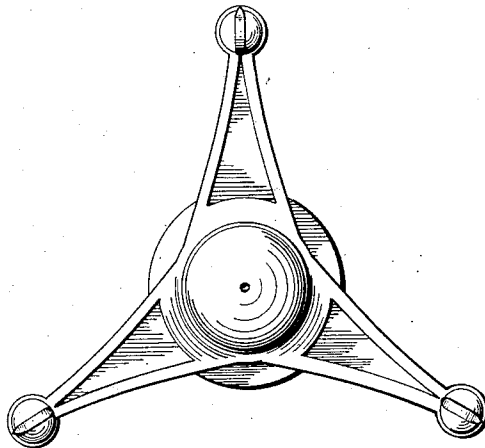

*To all whom it may concern:*

Be it known that I, ARTHUR J. MORGAN, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Canopy for Electric-Light Fixtures, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.
