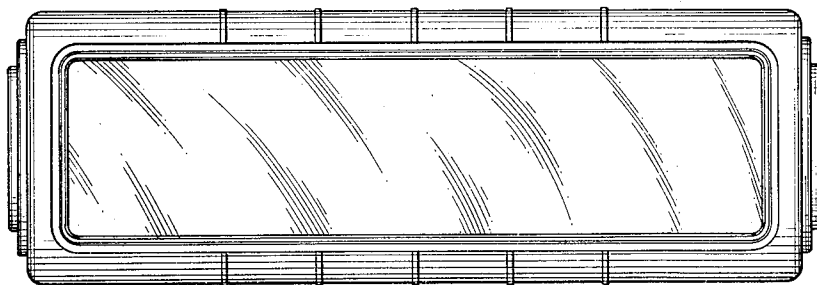

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Richard C. Marholz, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for a Combined Escutcheon Plate and Crystal for a Dial for a Radio Receiver, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof, in which:
