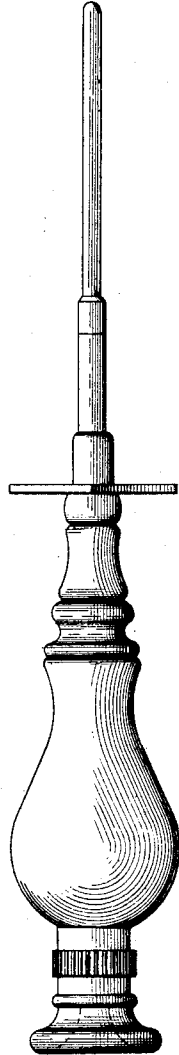

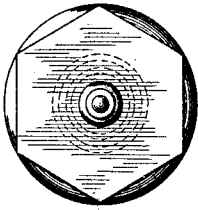
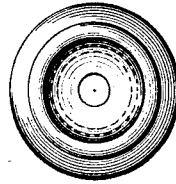

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, EDWARD SCHWARTZ, a citizen of the United States, residing at Chicago, in the county of Cook and State of Illinois, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Electric Hair-Singer, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

In the drawing, Figure 1 is a side elevation of the hair singer showing my design; Fig. 2 is an end view from the top; Fig. 3 is an end view from the bottom.

What I claim is:

The ornamental design for an electric hair singer, as shown.
