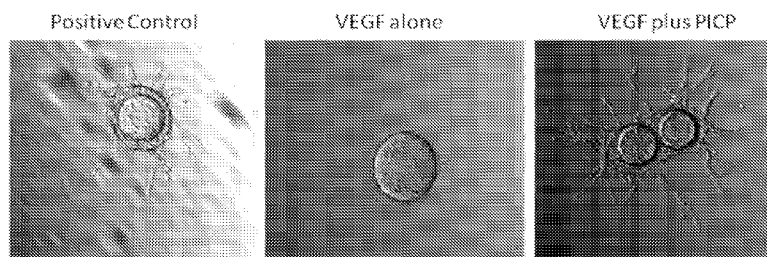

(57) Abstract: The present invention relates to the field of angiogenesis. More specifically, the present invention provides methods and compositions for modulating angiogenesis.
