CLEANING COMPOUND.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 496,274, dated April 25, 1893.

Application filed January 19, 1893. Serial No. 458,926. (No specimens.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLOTTE E. MOOR, of the city, county, and State of New York, have invented certain new and useful Improvements in Cleaning Compounds, of which the following is a specification.

The object of my invention is to produce an improved cleaning compound which may be manufactured at comparatively small cost, and which is specially efficacious for cleaning purposes.

My composition consists of the following ingredients combined in the proportions specified, viz.: prepared soap-bark or castile soap three ounces; ether two ounces; ammonia two ounces; glycerine two ounces; alcohol

two ounces; water four quarts. These ingredients are to be thoroughly mixed by agitation. The fluid is to be applied as a wash in the ordinary manner.

What I claim is—

The herein described composition of matter to be used as a cleaning fluid, consisting of soap, ether, ammonia, glycerine, alcohol, and water combined, substantially in the manner and in the proportions specified.
