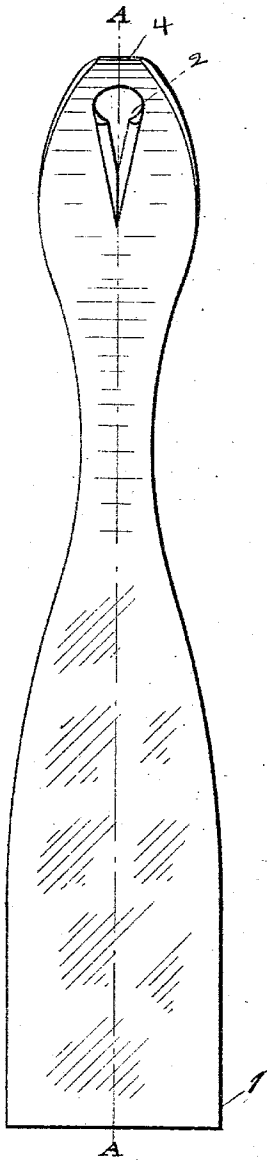

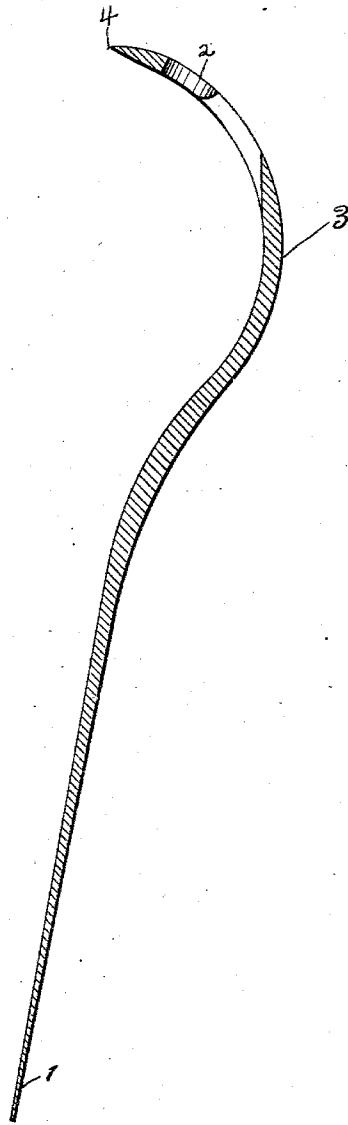

DAVID N. TARBOX, OF CEDARVILLE, OHIO.

COMBINATION-TOOL.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Letters Patent No. 743,590, dated November 10, 1903.

Application filed January 31, 1903. Serial No. 141,378. (No model.)

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DAVID N. TARBOX, a citizen of the United States, residing at Cedarville, in the county of Greene and State of Ohio, have invented a new and useful Combination-Tool, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description thereof.

My device consists of a novel tool which forms a combination of several useful tools used by glaziers and painters and combines them into one instrument, for a more complete description of which I refer to my drawings hereto annexed and made a part of this specification.

Figure 1 shows the back side elevation of the tool, and Fig. 2 shows a section on the lines A A of Fig. 1.

The one end of the tool (indicated by numeral 1) is used as a glazier's knife, and the other end is used for a nail-claw, having the claw placed as indicated by 2, and the end of the tool having the claw being bent so as to

form part of a circle and also forming on the back of this end having the claw a glazier's hammer, (indicated by 3.) At the point of the end 4 it is sharpened, so as to form a screw-driver, and thus I have the combination in one tool of a glazier's knife, a nail-claw, a glazier's hammer, and a screw-driver.

Having described my device, what I claim is—

In combination in a tack-puller, a flat straight handle portion having a broad terminal portion, a curved portion of increased thickness, an opening in the curved portion near the end thereof and a claw formed in said opening.
