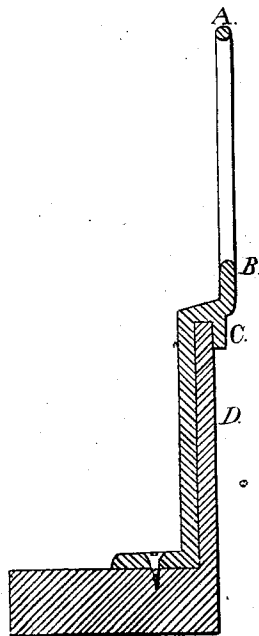
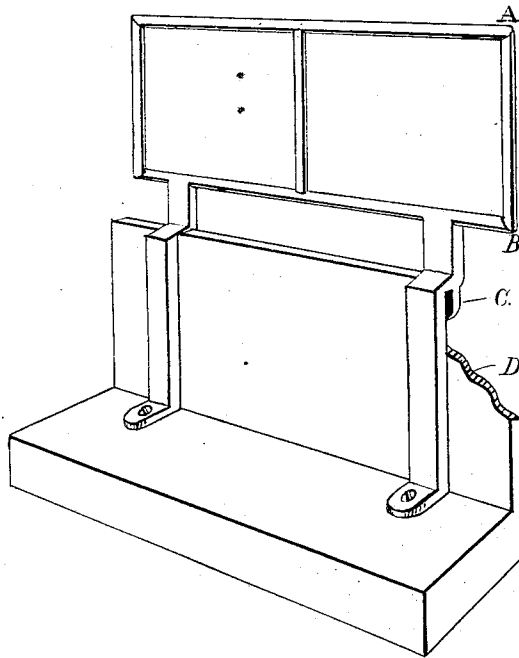

IMPROVEMENT IN ATTACHING DASH-BOARDS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **159,283**, dated February 2, 1875; application filed August 1, 1874.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, GEORG SCHAFFNER, of Troy, in the State of New York, have invented a Dash-Board Attachment for Wagons, of which the following is a specification:

The object of my invention is to furnish a means of more securely attaching the dash-board of a wagon than any in use heretofore.

The manner of attaching the dash-board in common use heretofore has been by bolts or rivets, confining the lower extending arms of the dash-board in parallel juxtaposition with the front end of the wagon. I propose to use a clip formed at the lower part of that portion of the dash-board which extends upward above the front end of the wagon, which shall

inclose a portion of the front end, as shown in the accompanying drawing.

In said drawing the dash-board is shown and indicated by the letters A and B, and the clip is indicated by the letter C, inclosing a part of the front end of the box, indicated by the letter D.

I claim as my invention—

The clip C at the lower part of a dash-board, in combination with the dash-board and the front end of a wagon, substantially as and for the purpose set forth.
