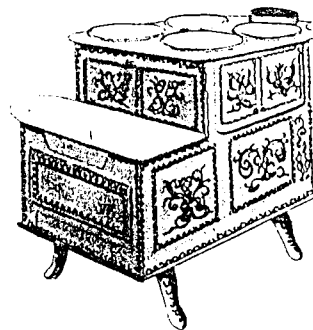

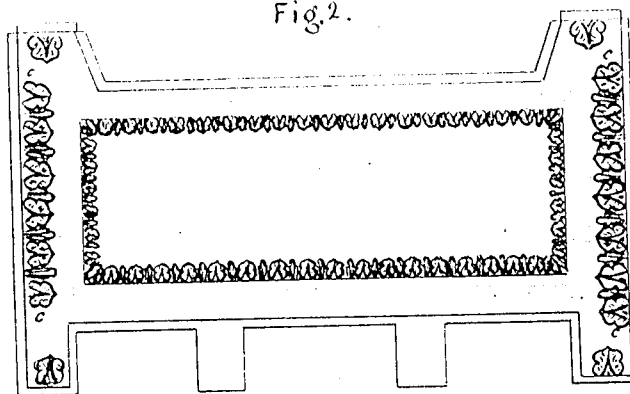
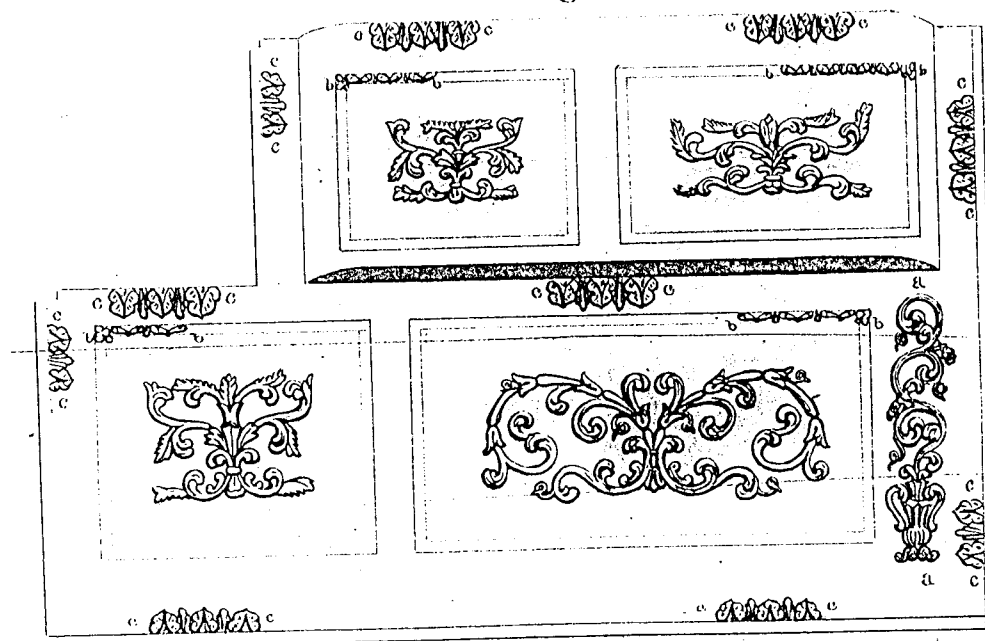

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, William Jackson, of Syracuse in the County of Onondaga and State of New York have invented or produced a new design for an Ornamented Cooking Stove, and I do hereby declare that the following is a full clear and exact description thereof reference being had to the accompanying drawings making part of this Specification.

Fig. 1. represents a perspective view of one of my ornamented stoves.

Fig. 2 exhibits a side (both sides being alike) upon an enlarged scale to shew the detail of ornament. Each panel is filled with a composition of scroll-work not easily described in words, but fully represented in the drawings. — The ornamental figure 22 near the end of the lower oven-door, represents a vase from which rises foliage.

The borders of the panels are all formed by a continuation of the figures shown at b b and the whole stove is surrounded with

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a border consisting of a continuation of the figures shown at c c - Fig. 2 represents the front lower plate - The other plates are plain with the exception of the border before mentioned. - The front and fire doors are alike.

What I claim as my invention, is the combination and arrangement of ornamental figures herein shown and described, forming a design for an Ornamented Cooking Stove.
