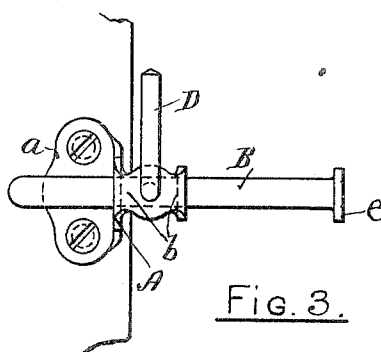
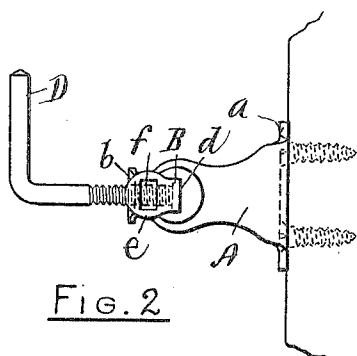
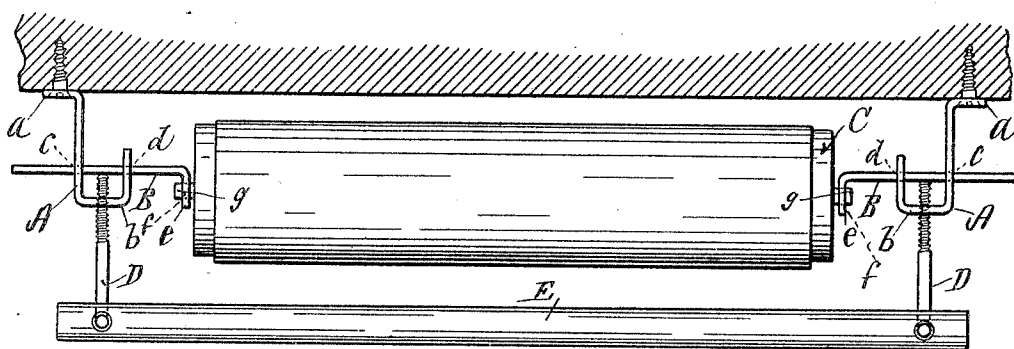

CURTAIN-FIXTURE.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, HENRY LOUIS SAUCIER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Centerville, in the State of Rhode Island, have
5 invented a new and useful Improvement in Curtain-Fixtures, of which the following is a specification.

My invention consists in the improved construction of the shade-roller bracket and in
10 the combination therewith of a bracket for holding the attaching-bar of a lace curtain.

In the accompanying drawings, Figure 1 represents the top view of my improved curtain-fixture. Fig. 2 represents a side view of
15 one of the brackets. Fig. 3 represents a front view.

In the drawings, A represents the shade-roller bracket formed with a base *a*, by means of which it is to be attached to the
20 window-casing, and with the bend *b*, and having the laterally-elongated perforations *c* and

d, adapted to receive the sliding roller-support B. The roller-support B is provided with the turned head *e*, having the perforation *f*, adapted to receive the bearing-pin *g* of
25 the shade-roller C, the said roller-support being also made adjustable by means of the screw-threaded bracket D, which serves to support the bar E for the lace curtain.

I claim as my invention—

In a curtain-fixture the combination of the
30 bracket A, having the attaching-base *a* the bend *b*, and the perforations *c* and *d*, with the roller-support B, and the screw-threaded bracket D, adapted to secure the said roller-
35 support in its adjusted position and for the support of a lace curtain, substantially as described.
