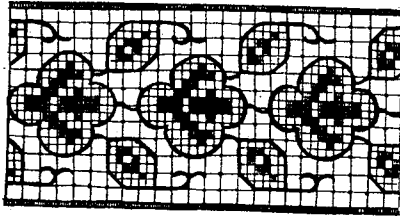

Be it known that I, HENRY SCHWARBER, a citizen of the United States, residing at Weehawken, in the county of Hudson and State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Embroidered Lace, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.
