

(54) Title: SYSTEM AND METHOD OF GENERATING A SECURED COMMUNICATION LAYER



(57) Abstract: Techniques for generating a secure communication layer for a certain software application in a computer system are disclosed. The certain application is configured and operable to exchange data via a communication interface using a specific protocol implementation. A communication protocol model is generated for the specific protocol implementation based on input data about the specific communication protocol and being associated at least in part with functioning of the certain application. The generated communication protocol model is used for generating a dedicated protection layer component corresponding to the specific communication protocol, wherein the dedicated protection layer component is capable of analyzing communication traffic data associated with the certain application and validating communication traffic data addressed to the certain application and complying with the generated protocol model.
