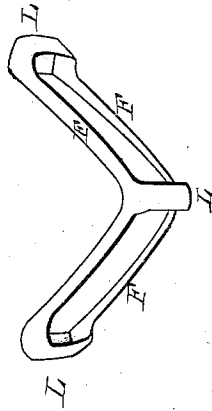
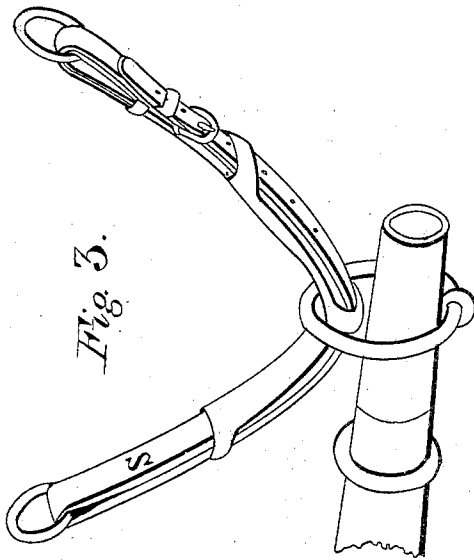

DEXTER PETTENGILL, OF DELHI, NEW YORK.

IMPROVED SLIDE FOR BREAST-STRAPS FOR HARNESS.

Specification forming part of Letters Patent No. **37,006**, dated November 25, 1862.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, DEXTER PETTENGILL, of Delhi, in the county of Delaware and State of New York, have invented a new and useful Slide for the Breast-Straps of Harness.

The nature of my invention consists of a slide for the breast-straps of harness, made of metal or any other suitable material, and is intended to prevent the wearing of the breast-strap by the neck-yoke (or pole-chain) ring; and I do hereby declare that the following is a full, clear, and exact description of the construction and operation of the same, reference being had to the annexed drawings, making a part of this specification, in which—

Figure 1 is a perspective view; Fig. 2, a transverse section of the body, and Fig. 3 a perspective view of the slide as applied to the breast-strap.

The body of the slide is made of different sizes, according to the kind of harness it is in-

tended to apply it on, and has a slight flange (marked F F, Figs. 1 and 2) on each side for the better protection of the edges of the breast-strap, and also the better to retain it in its place. The slide is also furnished with three or more loops, (marked L L L, Fig. 1,) through which the breast-strap passes, and which retain the slide on the breast-strap S, as shown in Fig. 3.

I do not confine myself to the precise form of the slide as shown by the drawings, nor to the number of loops upon it.

What I claim as my invention, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The slide and its application to the breast-straps of harness in the manner and for the purposes set forth in the above specification.
