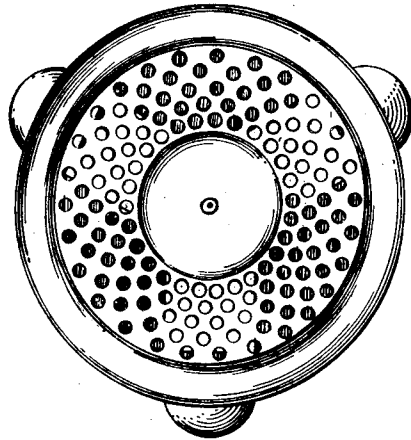

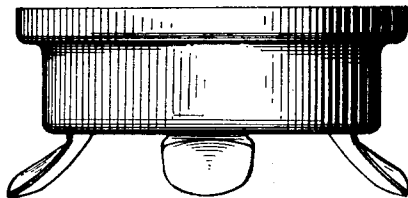

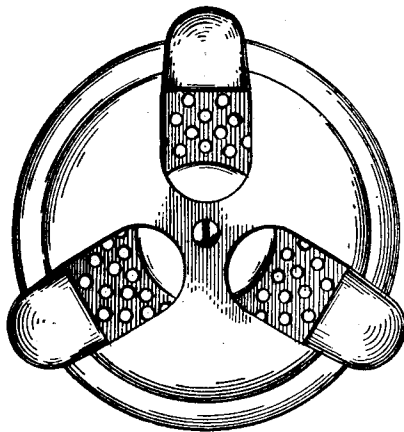

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, JOHN P. EUSTIS and ALBERT T. BROWN, both citizens of the United States of America, residing, respectively, at Newton and Arlington, county of Middlesex, and State of Massachusetts, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Dish-Stands, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming a part thereof.

Figure 1 is a plan of a dish stand showing our new design; Fig. 2 is a side elevation thereof; and Fig. 3 is a bottom plan.
