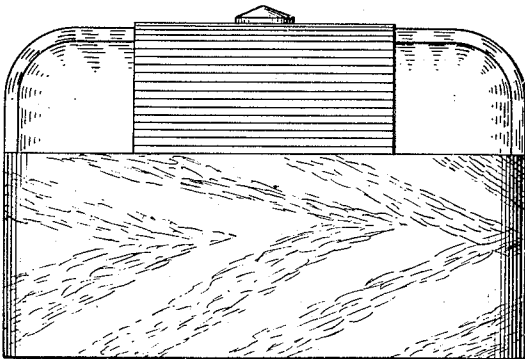
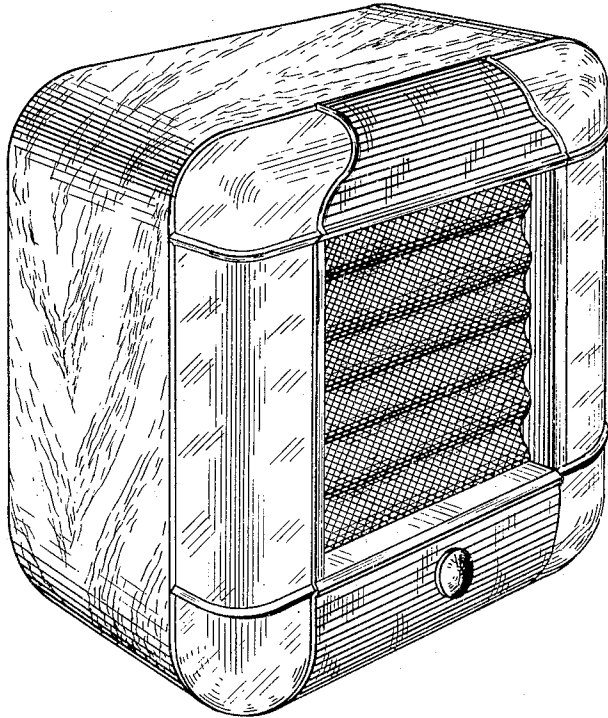

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Jay B. Doblin, a citizen of the United States, residing at Laurelton, Queens County, New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Loud Speaker Casing, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming part thereof.

In the drawing Fig. 1 is a perspective view of a loud speaker casing embodying my new design, and Fig. 2 is a bottom plan view of the casing.

Both sides of the casing are similar in appearance.
