

DESIGN FOR A PARASOL.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 16,634, dated April 20, 1886.

Application filed March 15, 1886. Serial No. 195,361. Term of patent $\frac{1}{2}$ years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, ALFRED C. HIRSH, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city and county of Philadelphia, State of Pennsylvania, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Parasol, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying photographic illustration, forming part thereof.

10 The leading feature of my design for a parasol is the body having an inwardly-turned rim and fringe or trimming pendent from the edge of said rim.

A represents the body of a parasol, and B the rim thereof, said rim being turned downwardly and inwardly, and from the edge of said rim depends fringe or trimming, C.

I claim--

A design for a parasol having a body with an inwardly-turned rim and fringe pendent from the end of said rim, as shown and described.
