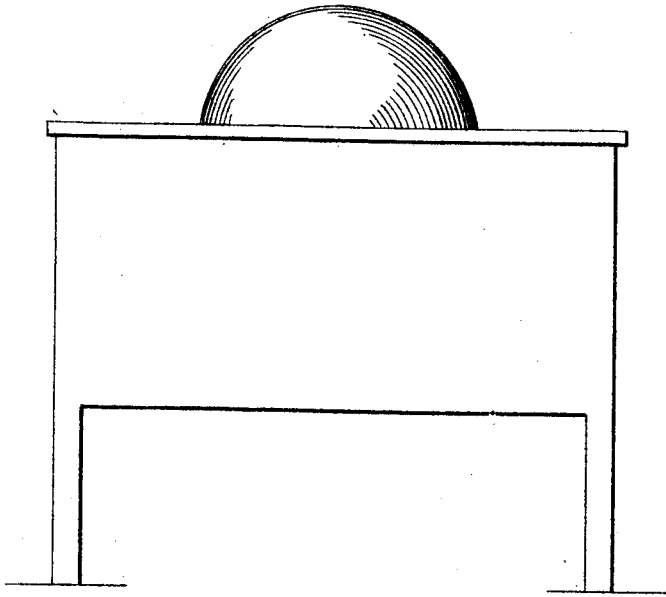

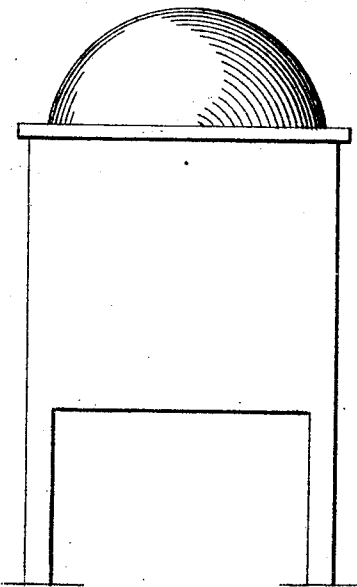
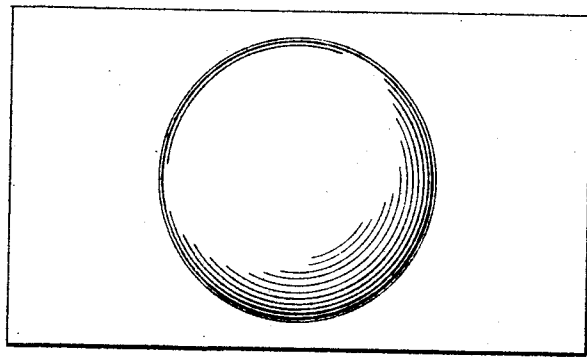

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, CHARLES T. WITTSTEIN, a citizen of the United States, residing at Newark, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Phonograph-Cabinets, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

Figure 1 is a front elevation of a phonograph cabinet embodying my new design; Fig. 2 is a side elevation thereof, and Fig. 3 is a top plan view thereof.
