



To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, Herman Krieger, a citizen of the United States of America, residing in New York city, county of New York, and State of New York, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for an Embroidered Fabric, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof, wherein, the figure on the drawing is a plan view of a piece of embroidered fabric showing my new design, which is repeated lengthwise along the fabric as shown.

I claim:

The ornamental design for an embroidered fabric, substantially as shown and described.
